#### Michael Cichan Paleobotanical Research Grant

Deadline: March 15 (annually)

The purpose of this grant is to provide funds for those who have completed a PhD and are currently in a post-doctoral position or a non-tenure track position. Funds are to be used to support research activities for the awardee. Funds up to \$2500 may be awarded.

## **Submission Materials:**

- 1. Abstract (300 words)
- 2. Narrative must include: a description of the research, including appropriate conceptual background, purpose or objective, brief outline of methodology, and potential contribution or significance to paleobotany. Not to exceed two single spaced pages.
- 3. Budget detailing how the funds would be used (one page). Include any other available funds, and if budget exceeds amount of this award, where additional funds will come from.
- 4. Literature Cited (one page)
- 5. Current CV
- 6. One letter of support (emailed separately to the Paleobotanical Section Secretary)

## **Review Process:**

- 1. The Section chair will form a committee to review all submitted grants each year and determine awardee(s).
- 2. Committee members should represent various research foci and geologic time periods.
- 3. The award will based on merit and feasibility of the project.
- 4. The winner will be announced at the Paleobotanical Banquet.

# Eligibility:

- 1. Must be an active member of the Botanical Society of America: Paleobotanical Section.
  - Must have been a member for at least two years prior to the proposal submission.
- 2. Must be a post-doctoral researcher or have a non-tenure track (e.g., lecturer, adjunct, collections manager, research scientist) position.
- 3. Must be active in research as evidenced by conference presentations (oral or poster) and paper submissions (accepted and rejected).
- 4. Have not been awarded this in the past three years with priority given to those who haven't received the award in the past

## Conditions of award:

- 1. Awardees must submit a written progress report to the Section Secretary no later than 2 years after receiving award. This report will be published in the Paleobotanical Section newsletter.
- 2. Awardees are requested to present their research at BSA within 4 years of receiving the award.
- 3. Acknowledgement of the Paleobotanical Section, Botanical Society of America should be given in all presentations and publications relating from the work supported by this award.
